That's *really* good business. And you can be part of it by buying Just Change tea, spices and soap, or involving your community in the global Just Change network.

How does it work?

Just Change is about trade *justice*. We call it fair trade plus. Here's how it works.

- ✓ In India, a cooperative of indigenous people grows and plucks the tea, and, as part of Just Change, are paid a fair price at the outset.
- ✓ They trade their tea with local communities, and export it to the UK where Northern Tea Merchants, a family firm of fair trade tea specialists, pack and distribute it in the North.
- Marsh Farm Outreach, a community group in Luton, distributes it in the South and Midlands.
- ✓ Volunteers, fair trade shops, cooperatives, community groups and social enterprises sell the tea. Buyers can choose to add a premium.
- ✓ Members decide how any surplus generated should be distributed, ensuring that everyone in the Just Change network benefits.

The Just Change Story

Since 1986, adivasis from Gudalur, South India, have been fighting to reclaim their ancestral lands. A development group, ACCORD, helped them to plant tea on land that used to be theirs but had been taken over by big companies. The income from the tea helped them build a school and hospital. They then linked up with other producer groups around the country to form Just Change. Today, over 40,000 families are trading many products through the Just Change network.

In 2000, Just Change UK was set up to extend the benefits to low waged people in other countries.

"When I saw how much our friends, who want to support us, were paying for fair trade tea, I said how is this fair?' They should be paying less, not more!"
